A BILL INTITULED

An Act to alter the Constitution of the Council of the University Title. of Otago.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand 5 in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as

1. This Act may be cited as the University of Otago Council Short Title. Act, 1911.

2. There is hereby constituted a Professorial Board of the Professorial Board. 10 University of Otago (hereinafter referred to as the Professorial Board), which shall consist of all the professors of the said University for the time being, and of such lecturers of the University for the time being as the Council declares to be members of the said Board.

3. (1.) The members of the Council of the University of Otago Retirement of 15 in office on the commencement of this Act shall continue to hold present members of Council. office until the thirtieth day of June, nineteen hundred and twelve, and shall then go out of office.

(2.) On and after the first day of July, nineteen hundred and Reconstitution of twelve, the Council shall be constituted as follows:—

Council.

(a.) A group of two members appointed by the Governor;

(b.) A group of two members appointed by the Professorial Board;

(c.) A group of four members elected by the District Court of Convocation of the Otago University District as defined by the New Zealand University Act, 1908;

(d.) One member appointed by the Education Board of the District of Otago, and one member appointed by the Education Board of the District of Southland;

(e.) One member elected by the members of School Committees, as constituted under the Education Act, 1908, within the Otago University District.

(f.) One member appointed by the Dunedin City Council;

(q.) One member appointed by the Otago Hospital and Charitable Aid Board.

(h.) One member elected by the governing bodies of the secondary schools as defined by section eighty-nine of the Education Act, 1908, in the Otago University District;

(i.) One member elected by the teachers in public schools in the Otago University District holding certificates of competency under section fifty-four of the Education Act, 1908;

(j.) One member elected by those teachers in secondary schools, as defined by section eighty-nine of the Education Act, 1908, in the Otago University District who are graduates 10 of any British chartered university, or are holders of certificates of competency under section fifty-four of the Education Act, 1908; and

(k.) The members of the Council in office on the commencement of this Act who were appointed to that office before the 15 commencement of the University of Otago Council Elec-

tion Act, 1891.

(3.) The members of the Council mentioned in paragraph (k) of the *last preceding* subsection shall continue to hold office until they cease to hold office pursuant to section *nine* hereof.

4. (1.) Members appointed pursuant to paragraphs (b), (d), (f), and (g) of section three hereof shall be appointed by resolution passed at a meeting of the Board or Council making the appointment.

(2.) Members elected pursuant to paragraphs (c), (e), (h), (i), and (j) of the same section shall be elected in the manner hereinafter 25

appearing.

- (3.) The first appointments and elections of members pursuant to the said section three shall be made within the first seven days of the month of June, nineteen hundred and twelve, or as soon thereafter as may be convenient, and the members so appointed and 30 elected shall come into office on the first day of July, nineteen hundred and twelve.
- 5. (1.) For the purposes of elections of members pursuant to paragraphs (c), (e), (i), and (j) of section three hereof the following provisions shall apply:—

(a.) The Registrar of the University of Otago, or such other person as the Council appoints, shall be the Returning Officer who shall conduct all elections of those members.

(b.) The Returning Officer shall prepare separate rolls of the persons who are entitled to vote for a member or members 40 pursuant to the said paragraphs (c), (e), (i), and (j), and shall enter in the respective rolls the name, occupation, and address of every person who possesses the necessary qualification entitling him to vote; provided that no person shall be entered on more rolls than one.

(c.) Any person who possesses more qualifications than one shall be entitled to have his name transferred from one roll to another at any time before the closing of the rolls as here-

inafter mentioned.

(d.) All rolls shall be closed at five o'clock in the afternoon of the fourteenth day immediately preceding the day on which an election is to be held, and shall continue to

Procedure preliminary to elections. be closed until the election is completed; and no name shall be entered on any roll while that roll is closed.

(e.) Claims for enrolment or transfer shall be made and disposed of in accordance with regulations made by the Council.

(f.) At every election the votes shall be given by sealed voting- Voting at elections. papers, in the form prescribed by regulations made by the Council, delivered to the Returning Officer personally on or before the day fixed for the election, or forwarded to him by post or otherwise so as to reach him not later than that day.

(2.) For the purpose of the election of a member pursuant to paragraph (h) of section three hereof the following provisions shall

(a.) The governing body of each secondary school shall be. entitled to one vote for every hundred or part of a hundred pupils (exclusive of the pupils in any lower department) in average attendance for the year ending on the thirty-first day of December immediately preceding the election:

(b.) The votes of each such governing body shall be by resolu-

tion passed at a meeting of that governing body:

(3.) In any election to which this section refers the majority of votes shall decide the election, but in the case where two candidates have an equal number of votes the Registrar shall determine the 25 election by lot in the presence of the Chairman or other member of the Council.

6. No member of the Professorial Board shall be a member of Professors eligible the Council unless he is appointed a member by that Board pursuant only as

to paragraph (b) of section three hereof.

7. Subject to the provisions of the next succeeding section, the 30 term of office of all members appointed or elected as provided by paragraphs (a), (b), and (c) of section three hereof shall be four years, and of all other members, except members in office under paragraph (k) of that section, shall be two years; but all members shall 35 continue to hold office until the appointment or election of their successors.

8. (1.) The members of the Council who are in office on the Retirement of first day of July, nineteen hundred and twelve, shall continue to hold members of groups.

office subject as hereinafter in this section mentioned.

(2.) On the first day of July, nineteen hundred and fourteen, and on the same day in each second year thereafter, one-half of the members comprising each of the groups mentioned in the said

paragraphs (a), (b), and (c) shall retire from office.

(3.) The members to retire from each of such groups on the first 45 day of July, nineteen hundred and fourteen, shall, on or before the first day of May in that year, be decided by lot amongst the members of that group; and the members to retire as aforesaid on the first day of July in every second subsequent year shall be those who have been longest in office without reappointment or re-election.

9. (1.) If any member of the Council—

(a.) Dies, or by writing addressed to the Council resigns his seat: or

Casual vacancies.

(b.) Becomes bankrupt; or

(c.) For a period of three consecutive months fails to attend any meeting of the Council without obtaining leave of absence; or

(d.) Is absent from New Zealand for a period of six consecutive months without obtaining leave of absence,—

he shall cease to be a member, and the vacancy thereby created shall be deemed a casual vacancy.

(2.) The member filling a casual vacancy shall hold office only

for the residue of the term of the vacating member.

10. (1.) Whenever a vacancy, whether casual or otherwise, occurs which is to be filled up by appointment by the Governor, it shall be the duty of the Council to forthwith report the fact to the Minister of Education.

(2.) Whenever a vacancy, whether casual or otherwise, occurs 15 which is to be filled up by appointment by the Professorial Board, or by any Education Board, or by the Dunedin City Council, it shall be the duty of the Council to forthwith report the fact to the Board or Council which appointed the vacating member.

(3.) Whenever a vacancy, whether casual or otherwise, occurs 20 that is to be filled up by election, it shall be the duty of the Council to do all things necessary for the proper conduct of that election.

(4.) Each vacancy, whether casual or otherwise, shall be filled up by the same authority as that which appointed or elected the vacating member.

11. (1.) The appointment or election of a member to fill up a vacancy caused by the expiry of the term of office of a vacating member shall be made within the first seven days of the month of June next preceding such expiry, or as soon thereafter as may be convenient, but shall not take effect until such expiry.

(2.) The appointment or election of a member to fill up a casual vacancy shall be made not later than thirty days after the vacancy

(3.) Every retiring member shall be eligible for reappointment or re-election.

(4.) If any vacancy is not filled up within sixty days after the same occurs, the Governor shall forthwith fill up the vacancy by appointing some fit person as a member in place of the vacating member.

12. The University of Otago Council Election Act, 1891, is 40 hereby repealed.
