## A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to constitute permanent Boards for the Education Districts Title. of Westland and Grey respectively.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in 

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Westland and Grey short Title. Education Boards Act, 1885."

2. The divisions of the colony described in the Schedule to this Constitution of Act are hereby constituted education districts for the purposes of Westland and Grey Education Districts. 10 "The Education Act, 1877" (herein referred to as "the said Act"),

and shall be called by the names set over each such description.

3. The Education Board of the Education District of Westland, Westland and Grey and the Commissioners exercising the functions of an Education Education Boards to continue in office Board within the Education District of Grey, as such Board and till 1886.

- 15 Commissioners were constituted respectively under "The Westland Education District Subdivision Act, 1884," shall, notwithstanding the expiry of the last mentioned Act, continue in office until the thirty-first day of March next after the passing of this Act, and all property vested in such Board and Commissioners shall remain vested 20 in them so long as they remain in office.
  - The words "Board" or "Education Board" in this Act shall be deemed to include the Education Board of Westland and the aforesaid Commissioners for the Education District of Grey, so long as they remain in office.

Permanent Education Boards how formed.

4. There shall be for each of the Education Districts of Westland and Grey an Education Board, consisting of six members, three of whom shall be appointed by the Governor and three elected as hereinafter provided.

(1.) Between the first and the thirty-first days of January, one 5 thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, each of the Committees in each district shall transmit to the Board the name of one person qualified to be a member of the Board, his written consent being first obtained, and the Board shall thereupon publicly notify the name of such 10 person, and in such notice shall also state the day on which the election of the Board shall be held, and shall also transmit to each Committee the name of such person.

The day of election shall be some day not later than 15 the fifteenth of March.

- (2.) On or before the last day of February in the same year, the Committee in each district shall send to the Secretary of the Board a list in writing, setting forth the full names of not more than three of the persons whose names have been 20 publicly notified as aforesaid.
- (3.) The Secretary shall carefully keep all such lists, and on the day fixed by the Board shall proceed to ascertain what persons, so nominated, have the greatest number of votes; and the three persons who have the greatest number of 25 votes shall be the elected members of the Board.
- (4.) After it has been ascertained what candidates have by an absolute majority of votes been duly elected, if it shall appear that there is an equality of votes for one or more candidates remaining to complete the number of three 30 elected members, the Board shall decide which of such persons shall be the member or members.
- (5.) If a Committee refuses or neglects to transmit to the Board either of the lists of names hereinbefore required to be transmitted, within the time appointed, the Board shall 35 proceed to the election of members notwithstanding such refusal or neglect.
- (6.) Every election shall be conducted publicly by the Board in such manner as it thinks fit.
- (7.) The Board shall publicly notify what persons have been 40 found to be elected, and such notification shall be signed by the Chairman of the Board, and shall be final and conclusive for all purposes.

A copy of such notification signed by the Chairman shall be transmitted to the Minister of Education without 45 delay.

(8.) In the event of three persons not being nominated as herein provided, the Board shall elect such a number of duly qualified persons as may be necessary to complete the number of the Board.

5. The members of the Board so elected shall take office on the Board to take office. thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

6. At some time before the thirty-first day of March, one Governor to thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, the Governor shall appoint for mominate three members for each each of the Education Boards of Westland and Grey three persons to Board. be members of such Boards respectively, who shall take office on such 5 last-mentioned day.

7. On the thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred Annual retirement and eighty-seven, and on the same day and month in every year of one-third of members of Board. thereafter, one of the nominated members and one of the elected members of each Board then in office shall retire.

The members to retire in the year one thousand eight hundred 10 and eighty-seven shall be determined by each Board by ballot not later than the thirty-first day of December immediately preceding.

In the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, another of the originally nominated members and another of the originally 15 elected members of each Board shall retire, and the members so

retiring shall also be determined by ballot not later than the day aforesaid.

And in every subsequent year the nominated member and the elected member of each Board shall retire who have served longest 20 upon such Board without re-appointment or re-election.

All retiring members shall be eligible for re-appointment or reelection.

8. In the month of March, one thousand eight hundred and Ordinary election to eighty-seven, and in the same month in every succeeding year, an fill vacancies.

25 election shall be held for the purpose of filling the vacancies caused by the retirement of members as herein provided.

Except as respects the number of persons to be elected, all the proceedings in and about such election shall be had and taken in the same manner as prescribed in section four upon the first election of 30 Boards.

9. All real property which immediately before the coming into Property vested in Boards before operation of this Act was vested in the Board and the Commissioners coming into operaappointed under "The Westland Education District Subdivision Act, tion of this Act to 1884," shall, on the date when the Boards appointed under this Act constituted under

- 35 respectively come into office, be vested in the Board of the district constituted under this Act wherein such property is situate; but the change of ownership hereby created shall not affect any valid lease, charge, or contract now subsisting in respect of any such land, but the same shall vest in the new Board subject thereto in all respects.
- In respect of any land affected by this Act which shall be held 40 by any title conferred under "The Land Transfer Act, 1870," or its amendments, the District Land Registrar of Westland shall, upon being satisfied thereof, and subject to the last-preceding enactment, enter in the register-book, and upon any instrument presented for that
- 45 purpose, a note of the change of ownership created by this Act, which shall be sufficient authority for that purpose.

10. The members of the several School Committees in office at Members of School the commencement of this Act shall be and be deemed to have been Committees now in duly elected, notwithstanding any defect in the mode or time of elected for new 50 election, and, until new elections shall be held, shall be deemed to be districts.

11. This Act shall be read and construed with "The Education Act, 1877," except in so far as the provisions therein contained are contrary to the provisions hereof; and all the provisions of the said Act shall extend and apply accordingly.

12. The School Commissioners for the Provincial District of 5 Westland, under "The Education Reserves Act, 1877," and "The Education Reserves Act, 1882," at present in office shall remain in office until the period of the next triennial election of such Commissioners, and at such election and every subsequent triennial election each of the Education Boards of the Education Districts of Westland 10 and Grey respectively shall elect one person to be a School Commissioner for the said provincial district, and shall respectively elect a successor to any such person in case of a vacancy in his office being created.

13. So much of the last-named Act is repealed as provides in 15 section two thereof that two persons shall be chosen by the Education Board of the Education District of Westland to be School Commissioners in the Provincial District of Westland.

### EDUCATION DISTRICT OF WESTLAND.

ALL that area in the Colony of New Zealand being the County of Westland, and the Boroughs of Hokitika, Kumara, and Ross.

### EDUCATION DISTRICT OF GREY.

All that area in the Colony of New Zealand being the County of Grey, and including the Borough of Greymouth.
