A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to alter the Boundaries of the Waimea and Inangahua Counties. Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in  
5 Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is “The Waimea and Inangahua Counties Boundaries Alteration Act, 1894.” Short Title.

2. After the passing of this Act the boundaries of the Waimea and Inangahua Counties shall be those defined in the Schedule hereto, in lieu of the existing boundaries of the said counties, as constituted by “The Counties Act, 1886.” Alteration of boundaries.

3. This Act shall be deemed a special Act within the meaning of “The Counties Act, 1886,” for the purpose of altering the boundaries of the Waimea and Inangahua Counties; and it shall come into force on the first day of October in the present year, and not before. Act to be a special Act. Commencement of Act.

SCHEDULE.

BOUNDARIES OF THE WAIMEA COUNTY.

BOUNDED towards the east by the Sounds County and Marlborough County, from the Croixelles Harbour to the Top House; thence by the boundary of the Amuri County to Mount McKay; thence by the summit of the range between Rotoiti and Sabine Rivers and the summit of the range between the Howard and Gowan Rivers to the foot of the last-mentioned range; thence by a straight line across the Buller River to the confluence of the Buller and Hope Rivers; thence by a straight line to Mount Owen; thence along the summit of the western ranges to Mount Arthur; thence along the summit of a leading range to and along the boundary of the Motueka Road District to the ocean, near Adele Island; and by the ocean to the starting-point in Croixelles Harbour.

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BOUNDARIES OF THE INANGAHUA COUNTY.

Bounded towards the west and north by the Buller and Waimea Counties to the confluence of the Hope and Buller Rivers; thence towards the east by a straight line across the Buller River to the foot of the main range between the Gowan and Howard Rivers; thence by the summit of that range and the summit of the main range between the Sabine and Rotoiti Rivers to Mount McKay; thence along the summit of the watershed to Mount Haast; thence westerly to the nearest point of the Grey River, and by the centre of that river to the confluence of the Otututu, and by the centre of that stream to its source near Mount Faraday; thence straight to Mount Faraday, the starting-point.
