An Act to amend the Law relating to Weights and Measures. BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as fol-

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Weights and Measures Short Title. Act Amendment Act, 1900"; and it shall form part of and be read together with "The Weights and Measures Act, 1868" (hereinafter called "the principal Act").

2. Every public weighbridge shall be examined, tested, and Public weighbridge

compared by the Inspector at least once in every year.

3. Section forty-one of the principal Act shall be construed Section 41 of subject to the modification that, in the case of such weighbridges or principal Act other weighing machines as are fixed or are not easily movable, the 15 Inspector upon receiving notice of the place where they are situate shall attend at such place and there compare them in terms of that

to be tested annually.

section. 4. The Governor, by Order in Council, may from time to time Regulations. make regulations for any of the purposes following, that is to say:—

- (1.) Prescribing the material of which weights and measures may lawfully be made;
- (2.) Prescribing the manner in which weights, measures, balances, steelyards, beams, and scales may be stamped;
- (3.) Prescribing the fees payable and penalties to be imposed for the purposes of the principal Act or of this Act, and from time to time varying the same; and for

(4.) Any other purpose which he deems necessary in order to give effect to the principal Act or this Act.

5. An Inspector shall not be in any way liable for any accidental Inspector not liable 30 damage done by him to any weight, measure, balance, steelyard, for accidental damage. beam, or scale while in the performance of his duty.
