A BILL INTITULED

An Act to amend "The Workers' Compensation for Accidents Title. Act, 1900."

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand 5 in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :-

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Workers' Compensation Short Title. for Accidents Act, 1905"; and it shall form part of and be read together with "The Workers' Compensation for Accidents Act,

10 1900" (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Act").

2. Notwithstanding anything in the principal Act or its amend- Minimum of weekly ments, it is hereby declared that the weekly payment in respect of compensation. compensation for total or partial disablement shall not be less than one pound per week in every case where the worker's ordinary rate 15 of pay for the work at which he was employed at the time of the accident was not less than thirty shillings per week.

3. (1.) Notwithstanding anything in the principal Act, the com- Compensation pensation payable in any case of total or permanent partial incapacity may be a lump sum may, in lieu of weekly payments, be such lump sum as is agreed on 20 at any time by the parties or as the Arbitration Court, on the appli-

cation of either party, determines.

(2.) Such lump sum may be invested or otherwise applied for the benefit of the worker as agreed or, in default of agreement, as determined by the Arbitration Court.
