A BILL INTITULED

An Act to amend the Wellington Harbour Reclamation Act 1955

5 WHEREAS certain doubts have arisen as to whether the application of ~~(section 28D of the Town and Country Planning Act 1953 (as inserted by section 25 of the Town and Country Planning Amendment Act 1966) to)~~ sections 28c and 28D of the Town and Country Planning Act 1953 is excluded by section 7 of the Wellington Harbour Reclamation Act 1955 and it is desired to clarify such doubts:

10 BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

15 **1. Short Title**—This Act may be cited as the Wellington Harbour Reclamation Amendment Act 1969 and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Wellington Harbour Reclamation Act 1955 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

Struck Out

2. Lands to be used for industrial purposes—Section 7 of the Wellington Harbour Reclamation Act 1955 is hereby amended by adding to subsection (3) the following proviso:
“Provided however that this subsection shall not deprive any person who or body which claims to be affected by any application for conditional use from the rights of objection and appeal conferred by the Town and Country Planning Act 1953 and its amendments.”

2. Conditional uses—Section 7 of the principal Act is hereby amended by adding the following subsection:
“(4) Nothing in this section shall limit or affect the provisions of sections 28c and 28d of the Town and Country Planning Act 1953.”
