A BILL INTITULED

An Act for securing to the Worker a Minimum Living Wage. BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

1. This Act may be cited as the Workers' Minimum Wage Short Title.

2. The term "worker" shall include all those who are depend- Interpretation. ent on wages or salary for the purpose of providing the necessaries 10 and luxuries of life.

3. Every worker of the Dominion, being over the age of twenty- Minimum weekly four years and under the age of sixty years, shall receive a weekly wage. wage at a rate of not less than three pounds per week for a week of forty-four hours.

4. Workers doing casual work, and who from the nature of their Workers receiving 15 work are prevented from obtaining a minimum wage of three pounds weekly wage may per week of forty-four hours, shall present themselves to the Depart-receive one day's ment of Labour nearest to their place of residence at seven o'clock pay from Labour Department. in the morning of any day on which their customary employment is

20 not available, and each worker so presenting himself shall be entitled to receive one day's pay at the minimum-wage rate of three pounds weekly.

5. Workers claiming minimum-wage pay under section four Workers claiming hereof shall do and perform such tasks and duties as the officer in be called upon by 25 charge of the Labour Department may provide; and, when work is Labour Department not immediately available, such worker shall stay in attendance at to perform certain duties. the office of the Labour Department at which he claims minimumwage rate for the full eight hours, with the customary time off for the midday meal.

6. The coming into operation of this Act shall be delayed for three months from the date of its passing, for the purpose of rearranging Customs duties, where necessary, to enable the extra wages charge to be made on the commodity affected in any particular industry.

7. No charge shall be made on commodities affected by this Act to an extent greater than is necessary to cover the actual amount

of increased wages charge.

8. Revenue for the purpose of this Bill to be provided by imposing a super charge equal to the amount of the annual expenditure 10 under this Bill upon incomes of amounts exceeding one thousand pounds taxable balance, proportioned in accordance with such graduated income-tax scale as may be for the time being in force.
