A BILL INTITULED

An Act to amend the Wyndham Recreation Reserve Act, 1877. BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as 5 follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Wyndham Recreation Reserve Short Title. Amendment Act, 1923, and shall form part of and be read together with the Wyndham Recreation Reserve Act, 1877 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

2. With respect to the land described in the Schedule to the Wyndham Town principal Act the Wyndham Town Board is hereby declared to be a Board declared a leasing authority under the Public Bodies' Leases Act, 1908.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Public Reserves Power to grant and Domains Act, 1908, or in the principal Act or any other Act, 15 the Wyndham Town Board may, with respect to the said land or any part or parts thereof, exercise all or any of the powers exercisable by a leasing authority under the Public Bodies' Leases Act, 1908, but so that the said land shall be available and accessible to the inhabitants of the Town of Wyndham and the surrounding district 20 for recreation purposes, subject to the control of the Wyndham Town Board as governing body, as provided for by section twentynine of the Public Reserves and Domains Act. 1908.

4. All rents, issues, and profits arising from the said lands Rents to be under any tenure whatever shall be expended in improving the said expended in improving land. 25 land.

5. Section five of the principal Act is hereby repealed.
