This Public Bill originated in the House of Representatives, and, having this day passed as now printed, is transmitted to the LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL for its concurrence.

## A BILL INTITULED

An Act to provide for the Establishment and Control of Stations Title. for the purpose of Wireless Telegraphy.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand 5 in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :-

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Wireless Telegraphy Short Title. Act, 1903"; and it shall form part of and be read together with "The Electric Lines Act, 1884."

2. The Governor may from time to time establish stations for Wireless telegraph the purpose of receiving and transmitting telegraph messages between established. New Zealand and parts beyond New Zealand by what is commonly known as "wireless telegraphy," including in that expression every method of transmitting messages by electricity otherwise than by 15 wires, whether such method is in use at the time of the passing of this Act or is hereafter discovered or applied.

3. The provisions of Part I. of "The Electric Lines Act, 1884," Application of "The shall, so far as applicable, mutatis mutandis, apply to stations list." established under this Act, and to communications by wireless

4. Every person who erects, constructs, or establishes any Penalty for station or plant for the purpose of receiving or transmitting communications by wireless telegraphy without having first obtained the consent of the Governor in Council is liable to a penalty not exceed-25 ing five hundred pounds, and any plant, machinery, instruments,

and material used by him for such purpose shall be forfeited and dealt with as the Commissioner directs.
