A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to provide for the Establishment of a Village-Settlement near the Borough of Waimate. Title.

WHEREAS it is expedient to establish a village-settlement near to the Borough of Waimate, and, there being no Crown land available, to enable the Governor to purchase a block of land for the said purpose: Preamble.

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Waimate Village-Settlement Act, 1886." Short Title.

2. The Governor, on behalf of Her Majesty the Queen, may enter into a contract with the owner of the lands mentioned in the Schedule hereto to purchase the said lands, at a price not exceeding the sum of *twelve* pounds per acre, and may covenant with such owner for the payment to him of the purchase-price agreed upon, either in cash or debenture-bonds, bearing *four* pounds per centum interest per annum, and payable at a date of not more than *twenty* years from the date of the issue thereof, or partly in cash and partly in debenture-bonds as aforesaid. Crown may purchase lands in Schedule.

3. The Colonial Treasurer may, without further appropriation, pay out of the Public Account all such moneys as may under such contract be payable in cash, and may issue debenture-bonds under the provisions of the foregoing section to an amount sufficient to provide for such payment. Colonial Treasurer may advance moneys for same out of Public Account.

4. The lands acquired by the Crown under the provisions of this Act shall be set apart for the purposes of a village-settlement, in accordance with the provisions of sections one hundred and sixty-six and one hundred and sixty-seven of "The Land Act, 1885." Lands to be set apart as a village-settlement.
