REASONS.

1. The House of Representatives disagrees with amendment in section 3, because it is of opinion that it is undesirable to give additional facilities for the naturalisation in New Zealand

of persons of the Chinese race who may have been naturalised in other colonies.

2. With regard to the proviso to section 4, the House of Representatives disagrees with the amendment for the following reason: The present law makes a distinction in the amount of fees to be paid by Chinese and by other foreigners for the enrolment of letters of naturalisation; the fee in the former case being 20s., and in the latter 2s. 6d.

The House of Representatives sees no reason why this principle, which was adopted by Parliament after careful consideration, should now be departed from, which would be the effect of requiresping in the amendment of the Lorislative Council

effect of acquiescing in the amendment of the Legislative Council.
