Hon. Mr. MONTGOMERY, in Committee, to move:—

In clause 2, line 3, after “smoke-house,” to insert “fishing-.” In line 4, before “place,” to insert “any public,” and, after “place,” to insert the words “as defined by section eighteen of ‘The Police Offences Act, 1884.’”

Hon. Mr. Rigg, in Committee, to move the following amendment:—

Clause 2: To strike out the words “with or,” and to strike out all the words after the word “warrant,” and substitute the following—namely, “open and search any barrel, box, bag, or other receptacle found in course of transit by any conveyance, boat, steamer, or other vessel, or in any open place whatsoever, suspected to contain oysters or other fish illegally taken; and any such collector, inspector, officer, or constable may enter any shop, curing-house, smoke-house, or other place in which fish is kept and search for oysters or other fish suspected to have been illegally taken, and, in the course of such search, to open barrels, boxes, bags, or other receptacles.”
