NOTICES OF MOTION.

1. The Honourable Mr. Gisborne to move, in Committee on the Bankruptcy Amendment Bill, the following new clauses:-

The debtor shall also, at the time of filing any declaration of List of property to be insolvency, deliver to the proper officer of the Court where the declaration is filed a list signed by him, and verified by affidavit written at the foot of such list, and duly made before a Justice of the Peace or any other person authorized by law to administer an oath, showing all his property and the estimated value thereof, and the place or places where the same is situated or deposited, and the names residences and occupations of his creditors, and he may from time to time add to or amend such list.

A copy of such list, and of every amendment thereof, shall Copy to be given to immediately after the filing of the same be delivered by the debtor to Provisional Trustee. the Provisional Trustee acting in and for the district within which the declaration of insolvency is filed.

2. The Honourable Captain Baillie to move, in Committee on the Borough Schools Bill, the following amendment: To erase clause 13, and insert the following in lieu thereof:-

For the purpose of raising the funds necessary for the establishment and support of schools under this Act, it shall be lawful for the School Committee, by requisition in writing addressed to the Mayor of the borough, to require the Council of the borough to make and levy a rate for such sum as may be agreed upon between the said Council and School Committee, not exceeding in any one year the amount of sixpence in the pound of the annual value of the rateable property within the borough; and thereupon the Council of the borough shall, at the time of making and levying the next general rate, make and levy a rate accordingly for the amount so agreed upon, not exceeding the amount aforesaid, in addition to any other rate which such Council is by law authorized to make and levy.
