DENTISTS AMENDMENT BILL.

Hon. Dr. FINDLAY, in Committee, to move the following clause in lieu of clause 2:—

Provision for
registration in
certain cases.

2A. (1.) Any person may apply to be registered as a dentist, and shall, on payment of the prescribed fee, be entitled to be so registered, who has passed an examination in dentistry by a Dental Board constituted under the Dentists Act, 1880, or who passes an examination in dentistry as prescribed by that Act by a competent Board set up by the Minister of Internal Affairs, if such person was in practice or working as a dentist in New Zealand, or was before or at the time of or within fifteen months subsequent to the passing of the Dentists Act, 1904, an apprentice of a person qualified to be registered under that Act.

(2.) No application for registration under this section shall be entertained unless made to the Registrar-General within three months after the coming into operation of this Act, and no person shall be registered under this Act after the thirty-first day of December, nineteen hundred and *eleven*.
