GAMING AMENDMENT BILL.

Hon. Sir FRANCIS BELL, in Committee, to move the following new clause:—

Section 5 of the
Gaming
Amendment Act,
1915, modified.

A. If in any year, commencing on the first day of August, licenses under the principal Act for the use of the totalizator at race-meetings have not been issued for the full number of days, as fixed by section five of the Gaming Amendment Act, 1910, and, in that year any racing club, by reason of the use or occupation of its land or buildings or any part thereof for military purposes, has held a less number of race-meetings than it held in the immediately preceding year, the Minister of Internal Affairs may, notwithstanding anything in the said section, issue to that club in the next succeeding year a license to use the totalizator on such number of days as he thinks fit, but so that the aggregate number of days on which the totalizator may be used in that year shall not exceed two hundred and fifty by a number greater than the difference between two hundred and fifty and the aggregate number of days on which the totalizator was authorized to be used in the preceding year.
