LICENSING AMENDMENT BILL.

Hon. Mr. BARR, in Committee, to move the following amendments:—

To add the following new clauses:-

Employment of minors in bars prohibited.

AA. (1.) After the first day of April, nineteen hundred and fifteen, no person under the age of twenty-one years shall be employed in any capacity in or about any bar (whether a public bar or otherwise) of any licensed premises at any time while liquor is sold.

(2.) If any such person is so employed, the licensee is liable to the penalties provided by section one hundred and ninety-five of the principal Act as if he had committed the offence of selling liquor

without being duly licensed to sell the same.

BB. (1.) After the first day of June, nineteen hundred and sixteen, save as provided by this section, no female shall be employed in any capacity in or about the bar or private bar of any licensed premises at any time while the bar or private bar is open for the sale of liquor.

(2.) Any person committing a breach of the provisions of this section shall be liable to a fine not exceeding ten pounds for every

day on which the offence is committed.

(3.) Nothing in this section shall apply to the employment or service of—

(a.) The wife or daughter of the licensee of the premises:

(b.) The licensee, being a woman.

(4.) Section thirty-six of the Licensing Amendment Act, nineteen hundred and ten, is hereby repealed.

Hon. Mr. Louisson, in Committee, to move the following amendments:—

Clause 4: To omit all the words after the word "subsection" in the fourth line.

To add the following new clause:—

CC. That section two hundred and three of the principal Act be amended by striking out the word "thirteen," and inserting the word "sixteen."
