MOTOR-VEHICLES INSURANCE (THIRD-PARTY RISKS) BILL.

The Right Hon. Sir FRANCIS BELL, in Committee, to move the following amendments:—

Clause 6, subclause (4): To omit paragraph (c), and substitute the following paragraphs therefor:—

(cc) Any claim against the owner of a motor-vehicle (not being a vehicle plying for hire or used in the course of the business of carrying passengers for hire) made in respect of the death of or of injury suffered by any person who was at the time of the accident in respect of which the claim has arisen being conveyed in the motor-vehicle, or was driving, or entering, or alighting from, or about to enter or alight from, such motor-vehicle:

(d) Any claim against the owner of a motor-vehicle plying for hire or used in the course of the business of carrying passengers for hire, made in respect of the death of or of injury suffered by any person who (not being a passenger for hire) was at the time of the accident in respect of which the claim has arisen being conveyed in the motor-vehicle, or was driving, or entering, or alighting from, or about to enter or alight from, such motor-vehicle.

Clause 15: To omit from subclause (1) all words after the word "section" in line 3, and substitute the words "ninety-four of the Post and Telegraph Act, 1928."
