NATIVE PLANTS PROTECTION BILL.

Hon. Mr. MASTERS, in Committee, to move the following amendments:—

Clause 2: To omit the word “pick” in line 5 (on page 2), and substitute the word “take”; and to omit the word “taking” in line 7.

Clause 4, subclause (1): To omit from this subclause all words after the word “Act” in line 1, and substitute the following words: “every person commits an offence who takes any protected native plant that is growing on any Crown land, or in any State forest or public reserve, or on any road or street, or who, without the consent of the owner or occupier of any private land, takes any protected native plant that is growing thereon”.

Clause 4, subclause (2): To omit the word “picking” in line 9 and also in line 15, and in each case to substitute the word “taking”.

Clause 6, subclause (1): To omit the word “pick” in line 26, and substitute the word “take”.
