1. Pharmacy Bill—third reading.

Contingent Notice of Motion.

The Honourable Mr. WATERHOUSE, on the third reading of the Pharmacy Bill, to move, That the Bill be recommitted with a view to the following amendments:—

Clause 11. Strike out the words “the members of the said Pharmaceutical Society,” and insert “pharmaceutical chemists.”

Clause 21. Strike out the clause.

Clause 29. In line 29, after “pharmaceutical,” insert “chemist or druggist, dispensing chemist, or other words of similar import.”

Clause 15. After “Deputy Registrar,” insert “of Births and Deaths.”

2. Native Reserves Bill—to be recommitted.

Contingent Notice of Motion.

The Honourable Sir F. DILLON BELL, when in Committee on the Native Reserves Bill, to move the addition of the following words to subsection 5 of section 3 (interpretation clause):—“and which lands shall by Order in Council be brought by the Governor under the operation of this Act.”
