PUBLIC HEALTH AMENDMENT BILL.

Hon. Mr. W. C. WALKER, C.M.G., in Committee, to move the following amendments:—

In clause 2: For the word "liable," substitute "which in his opinion is

likely.'' Add new subclause:—

(2.) Any goods imported contrary to the provisions of any such Order in Council shall be deemed to be goods prohibited to be imported under "The Customs Laws Consolidation Act, 1882," and shall be dealt with accordingly.

Add new clause:—

Vaccination exemption to be granted by Magistrate alone.

2A. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in section one hundred and seventy of "The Public Health Act, 1900," the certificate of exemption therein mentioned shall be granted by the Stipendiary Magistrate alone.

POLICE OFFENCES AMENDMENT.

Hon. Mr. W. C. Walker, C.M.G., in Committee, to move the following amendment:—

In clause 3: Omit the word "or" after "principal Act"; also the words "view or," and the words "passing therein or residing in such public place."

CEMETERY TRUSTEES VALIDATION BILL.

Hon. Mr. W. C. Walker, C.M.G., in Committee, to move the following amendments:—

Title: Add the words "and to amend 'The Cemeteries Act, 1882.'" Short Title: After the word "validation" add "and appointment." New clause:—

Road Boards may be appointed trustees. 6. Notwithstanding anything in "The Cemeteries Act, 1882," the Governor may from time to time appoint the Board of any road district situate within a county in which "The Counties Act, 1886," is in force to be the trustees of any cemetery situate within such road district, and thereupon the jurisdiction of the County Council over that cemetery shall cease.
