BAIL (MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS) BILL

Proposed Motion to Divide Bill into 3 Separate Bills

Hon. D. A. M. GRAHAM, in Committee, to move as follows:

That Part I be a separate Bill, and that for clause 2 there be substituted the following Title, enacting words, and Short Title clause:

An Act to amend the Summary Proceedings Act 1957BE IT ENACTED by the Parliament of New Zealand as follows:

1. Short Title and commencement—(1) This Act may be cited as the Summary Proceedings Amendment Act (No. 2) 1991, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Summary Proceedings Act 1957 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

(2) This Act shall come into force on the 1st day of December

1991.

That Part II be a separate Bill, and that for clause 18 there be substituted the following Title, enacting words, and Short Title clause:

An Act to amend the Crimes Act 1961

BE IT ENACTED by the Parliament of New Zealand as follows:

1. Short Title and commencement—(1) This Act may be cited as the Crimes Amendment Act (No. 2) 1991, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Crimes Act 1961 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

(2) This Act shall come into force on the 1st day of December

1991.

That Part III be a separate Bill, and that for clause 30 there be substituted the following Title, enacting words, and Short Title clause:

An Act to amend the District Courts Act 1947

BE IT ENACTED by the Parliament of New Zealand as follows:

1. Short Title and commencement—(1) This Act may be cited as the District Courts Amendment Act (No. 2) 1991, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the District Courts Act 1947 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

(2) This Act shall come into force on the 1st day of December 1991.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This Supplementary Order Paper contains the appropriate motion to divide the Bail (Miscellaneous Provisions) Bill into 3 separate Bills—the Summary Proceedings Amendment Bill (No. 2), the Crimes Amendment Bill (No. 2), and the District Courts Amendment Bill (No. 2).
