NOTICES RELATING TO ORDERS OF THE DAY.

ON GOING INTO COMMITTEE OF SUPPLY.

- Mr. PYKE to move, That this House will not assent to the discontinuance of subsidies to local bodies until other and adequate provision has been made for the continuance and prosecution of local public works.
- Mr. TOLE to move, That this House is of opinion that relief should be granted to S. J. Edmunds, of Auckland, in respect of his claim for losses sustained during the Native disturbance in the Bay of Plenty.
- Mr. MOSS to move, That this House will, on \_\_\_\_\_, resolve itself into a Committee of the Whole, to consider of a respectful Address, to be presented to His Excellency the Governor, praying that he will cause the sum of £4,000 to be placed upon the Supplementary Estimates, in aid of a building for the Auckland College and Grammar School.

COUNTIES ACT 1876 AMENDMENT BILL.

Mr. WRIGHT, in Committee, to move the following amendment in clause 4:—

The expression "Public Works" in "The Counties Act, 1876," and in any Act amending the same, shall mean and include branch railways, tramways, county roads, bridges, docks, quays, piers, wharves, and harbour works, reclamation of land from the sea, protection of land from encroachment or destruction by sea or river, works for water supply, irrigation purposes, drainage of land, hospitals, lunatic asylums, and public gaols, and also any public buildings required for the use of the Council or the government of the County.
