NOTICES RELATING TO ORDERS OF THE DAY.

COUNTIES ACT 1876 AMENDMENT BILL.

Mr. \_\_\_\_\_, in Committee, to move the addition of the following new clause and Schedule:—

The boundaries of the Peninsula County shall henceforth be those set forth in the Schedule to this Act, and all that portion of the road generally known as the Anderson's Bay Road, leading from the City of Dunedin to the former boundary of the Peninsula County, and which is not included within any borough, shall be deemed a county road within the meaning of "The Public Works Act, 1876," and the Council of the Peninsula County shall have the care and management of the said road.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that piece or parcel of land in the Provincial District of Otago, in the Colony of New Zealand, bounded towards the North by the high-water mark of Otago Harbour, from the Ocean Beach Railway line in Section No. 70, Block VII., Town District; towards the East and South by the ocean, to a point where the line of high-water mark is intersected by the north-eastern boundary line of Section No. 79, Block VII., Town District, produced; thence towards the West to and by that line and the north-western boundary of Section No. 79, and part of Section No. 80; thence by a right line across a road line and along the south-western boundary of Section No. 71 to the Anderson's Bay Road; thence along the south-western boundary line of said road to the Dunedin Town Belt; towards the North-west by said town belt; towards the North-east by the north-east boundary line of said road to the south-eastern boundary of the Borough of South Dunedin; again towards the North-west by said borough to the north-eastern side of the Ocean Beach Railway; and thence along that side of the railway to high-water mark in Section No. 70, Block VII., Town District, the starting point.

Mr. PYKE, in Committee, to move the addition of the following new clause:—

Notwithstanding anything in "The Counties Act, 1876," or any amending Act, no person shall be qualified to be elected or to sit and vote as a member of any Council unless he is a resident in such county.

Mr. SHEPHARD, in Committee, to move the following new clause:—

Where, by any Act or Ordinance of any Superintendent and Provincial Council providing for the registration of dogs and the collection of fees therefor, it is provided that any appointment is to be made, or any powers and duties are to be exercised and performed in any Province by the Superintendent, either with or without the advice of his Executive Council, and which by virtue of "The Abolition of Provinces Act, 1875," are now to be made, exercised, and performed by the Governor, such appointments, duties, and powers shall hereafter within those parts of the colony within which any such Act or Ordinance is in force, and which are included in any county in which the whole of "The Counties Act, 1876," has been brought into force, be made, exercised, and performed by the Council of such county.
