COUNTIES ACT AMENDMENT BILL.

Mr. REEVES, in Committee, to move the following new clauses:—

Ridings may be annexed to other counties.

In addition to the powers contained in section thirty of "The Counties Act, 1876," the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation, alter the boundaries of any county, and from and after a day to be named in such Proclamation the new boundaries set forth in such Proclamation shall be the boundaries of such county, subject however to the condition that a petition shall have been presented to the Governor, signed by three-fourths of the ratepayers of a riding, praying that such riding may be severed from the county in which it is situated, and made a part of some other and contiguous county.

Certain provisions to be in force.

The provisions of sections thirty-one, thirty-two, thirty-three, thirty-four, and thirty-five shall be read with and be deemed to be part of this Act.
