DIVORCE ACT 1898 AMENDMENT BILL.

Mr. Barber, in Committee, to move, That the new subclause proposed to be inserted in clause 2 be altered to read as follows:—

(5.) On the ground that the respondent is a lunatic within the meaning of "The Lunatics Act, 1882," and has been confined as such in an asylum either for a continuous period of seven years or for a broken period of five years extending over a term of not less than ten years:

Provided that the Court shall not be bound to pronounce a decree dissolving any marriage if it is satisfied that, on the evidence adduced, there are substantial reasons for believing that the respondent may

permanently recover his or her sanity.
