ELECTORAL ACT AMENDMENT BILL.

Mr. PIRANI, in Committee, to move the following new clauses:—

It shall be the duty of the Registrar, as soon as may be convenient, to notify all persons whose claims are sent in after the printing of the main roll that they have been duly enrolled.

When a Registrar has received notice from an elector to transfer his name to another district, he shall transmit a copy of such notice to the Registrar of such district, after filing the original notice in his office.

Any Registrar who strikes off the name of any elector, or places the name of any elector on any roll in consequence of the redistribution of electorates, shall, as soon as may be convenient, give notice of his having done so to the Registrars of adjoining electorates.

Any Deputy Returning Officer, after the hour fixed for the close of the poll, shall declare the result of the voting at the polling-booth of which he is in charge immediately after ascertaining the number of votes recorded for each candidate.

The result of the voting at any polling-booth shall not be specifically declared when the number of such votes does not exceed thirty, but shall be declared by the Returning Officer under the heading "Miscellaneous."

Any scrutineer may make known the names of persons who have voted at any time before the close of the poll.
