DENTISTS BILL.

Mr. JOYCE, in Committee, to move the following amendments:—

Title of Bill to be amended to read, "An Act to amend the Acts relating to Dentists."

After clause 1 insert,—

2. The sixth section of "The Dentists Act, 1880," is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof it is enacted that any person being the holder of a certificate (however designated) granted by any person or body in a British possession duly empowered for that purpose, showing that the holder is entitled to practise dentistry in such possession, shall, on proof that he is of good character, and on payment of the registration fee, be entitled to be registered under "The Dentists Act, 1880," without any further examination.

The proof that the person or body granting the certificate to practise dentistry was duly empowered to do so shall lie upon the person so applying for registration in New Zealand.
