ELECTORAL BILL.

Dr. NEWMAN, in Committee, to move the following new clause:—

Officers and men of the Permanent Militia are entitled to vote at elections for members of the General Assembly; and clause seventy-eight of the Defence Act of 1886 is hereby repealed.

Mr. TANNER, in Committee, to move to insert after clause 14,—

Provided that in no case shall any elector's claim for transfer in virtue of a non-residential qualification in another electoral district be entered on the roll of such district during the time which elapses from a vacancy occurring in such district to the return of the writ.

NORTH ISLAND MAIN TRUNK RAILWAY LOAN APPLICATION ACTS AMENDMENT BILL.

Mr. CADMAN, in Committee, to move to amend the Schedule by the insertion, at the end of line 14, the following words: "to the southern boundary of the Oruamatua Block; thence by that boundary to the Rangitikei River; thence by that river to the southern boundary of the Mangaohane Block, and thence by that boundary to the summit of the Ruahine Range; thence by the summit of the Ruahine Range aforesaid and the south-eastern boundary of the Awarua Block to its south-eastern corner; thence towards the south generally by the southern boundary of the last-named block to the Rangitikei River; thence by that river to;" and by the omission of the words "and the Rangitikei River to," in line 15, and the words "towards the south generally," in line 16.

ROAD BOARDS ACT 1882 AMENDMENT BILL.

Mr. O'CONNOR, in Committee, to move the following new clause:—

Notwithstanding anything contained in "The Road Boards Act, 1882," or any amendment of the same, it shall be lawful for the members of any Road Board to vote to any of the members thereof reasonable travelling-expenses going to or coming from meetings of the Board, provided a resolution of ratepayers, convened for the purpose, shall sanction such payments, and fix the rate thereof. Any resolution so carried shall be in force until terminated by a subsequent resolution carried by a meeting at which half the ratepayers in number and value shall vote to rescind the former resolution.
