6. The first Board of Governors elected under this Act shall take office on the thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, and

the present Board shall hold office till that date.

EIGHT HOURS BILL.

Contracts may be made at variance with the provisions of this Act; but no such contracts shall be allowed to be good unless the same shall be made in writing, signed by the parties thereto or their agents thereunto lawfully authorized, and unless each signature thereto be attested by at least one witness.
