THE EMPLOYMENT OF FEMALES AND OTHERS AMENDMENT BILL.

Mr. Hutchison, in Committee, to move the following additional clauses:—

Every factory (as interpreted in the said Act) and every establishment or place of business (as referred to in this Act) shall be provided with such sanitary and other conveniences, and shall provide such working and other accommodation, as the person appointed under the eleventh section of the said Act may from time to time reasonably require. Any breach of this provision shall be punishable by a fine not exceeding *five* pounds for every day such breach shall continue.

Any such person authorised as aforesaid may enter and inspect any factory, establishment, or place of business at any time he shall have reasonable ground to suspect that a breach of the said Act or of this Act is then taking place.

It shall be the duty of every person authorised as aforesaid to report once a month to the Inspector of Police of the district as to the working of the said Act and its amendments.

After the word "newspaper" in the fifth line of the second section of "The Employment of Females and Others Act 1881 Amendment Act, 1885," there shall be inserted the words "or in fellmongering or the washing, sorting, or bleaching of wool."
