### FINANCE (No. 2) BILL

AMENDMENTS proposed by His Excellency the Administrator of the Government:—

To add the following clauses:—

**29.** (1) Section two of the Emergency Forces Act 1950 (as amended by the Emergency Forces Amendment Act 1951) is hereby further amended by omitting the words "end of the year nineteen hundred and fifty-two", and substituting the words "end of the year nineteen hundred and fifty-three".

(2) The Emergency Forces Amendment Act 1951 is hereby consequentially repealed.

**30.** (1) The control of Prices Act 1947 is hereby amended by inserting, after section twenty-nine, the following section:—

"29A. Notwithstanding the provisions of this Act, where a written application has been made to the Price Tribunal for an approval under section sixteen hereof, nothing in this Act shall be construed to render unlawful any contract of sale between the applicant and any other person whereby the price of any goods to which the application relates is fixed with reference to the authorized selling price of the goods to be approved by the Tribunal pursuant to the application."

(2) Paragraph (a) of subsection one of section thirty-two of the Control of Prices Act 1947 is hereby repealed.

**31.** Price Order No. 1277 made under the Control of Prices Act 1947 and published in the *Gazette* on the ninth day of August, nineteen hundred and fifty-one, shall be deemed to have come into force on the first day of July, nineteen hundred and fifty-one.

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

CLAUSE 29 extends the Emergency Forces Act 1950 for one year, to the end of 1953.

Parts I and II of the Act have been repealed by the New Zealand Army Act 1950 and the Royal New Zealand Air Force Act 1950. The only remaining part is Part III, which authorizes the making of emergency regulations for the benefit of persons serving in the armed forces in connection with any United Nations emergency.

*Clause 30:* This clause authorizes persons who have made written application to the Price Tribunal for an approval under section 16 of the Control of Prices Act 1947 to agree that the price of any goods to which the application relates shall be fixed with reference to the price ultimately approved by the Tribunal.

This is at present precluded by paragraph (a) of subsection 1 of section 32 of the Control of Prices Act 1947, and that paragraph is repealed by subclause (2) of the proposed new clause.

*Clause 31:* The Price Order which is given retrospective effect by the clause fixed the price of phosphatic fertilizers. Those prices are usually fixed on 1 July in each year, but in 1951 the Price Order could not be issued until 9 August. Deliveries of fertilizer took place between 1 July and 9 August at a price agreed to be that fixed by the anticipated Price Order. The effect of the clause is to validate these agreements.
