1. Mr. De Lautour to move, when in Committee on the Waste Lands Administration Bill, in the title to Part IX., styled "The existing law," the addition of "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," "The Gold Fields Act 1866 Amendment Act, 1875."

Also, when in Committee on the said Waste Lands Administration Bill, to move the

insertion of a new clause :-

Nothing contained in "The Gold Fields Act, 1866," or the several Acts amending the same, relative to the sale or lease of waste lands of the Crown, or to the cancellation or suspension of any pastoral license or lease, with or without the consent of the licensee or lessee, shall be interpreted to confer any power upon the Superintendent to deal with any waste lands upon proclaimed gold fields, other than to provide depasturing facilities for mining communities resident upon any such proclaimed gold field.

- 2. Sir G. Grey to move, on going into Committee of Supply, For the appointment of a Select Committee to inquire into the cost to the colony of the two missions of Sir Julius Vogel to England. Such Committee to consist of Mr. Andrew, Hon. Major Atkinson, Mr. Lusk, Mr. Stevens, Mr. Rolleston, Mr. Rees, and the Mover; with power to call for persons, papers, and accounts, and to report thereon within four weeks; five to be a quorum.
- 3. Mr. Murray to move, on going into Committee of Supply, That, except in the case of a change of Government, it is not desirable that any Member of this House should become a member of the Executive Council till after he has sought and obtained re-election; and that the Government should take immediate steps to give effect to the above Resolution.
