NOTICES RELATING TO ORDERS OF THE DAY.

NATIVE LAND COURT ACT AMENDMENT BILL.

Mr. McDONALD, in Committee, to move the following new clauses :—

**16.** Notwithstanding anything contained in “The Native Land Act, 1873,” the Court shall have full power to deal with lands under this Act or the said Act, the grants for which have issued under any repealed Act, or which are included in “The Native Grantees Act, 1873.”

**17.** When any order of partition is made of land during the subsistence of any lease of the land comprised in such order, in such case such order shall not take effect to the detriment or injury of the holder or person beneficially interested in such lease; but in every such case it shall be the duty of the Court to assess the rent to be paid by the lessee or lessees for each part of the said land according to the comparative value thereof; and the owners of each part of such land shall be entitled to receive the rent attached to such part by the Court, and the lessee or lessees shall be liable to pay such rent to the respective owners of each such part.

**18.** In case any sole owner or any number of collective owners shall be desirous of selling the land they hold under memorial of ownership or certificate of title, and either before or after any partition shall have been made of any such land, in terms of “The Native Land Act, 1873,” the said Act, or this Act, the Court shall be satisfied that a majority of the owners in number and value shall have assented to such sale.

Section fifty-nine of “The Native Land Act, 1873,” so far as it is repugnant to this Act, is hereby repealed.

LICENSING ACT AMENDMENT BILL.
