LICENSING ACTS AMENDMENT BILL.

Mr. TAYLOB, in Committee, to move the following amendments :---

To insert new clauses :---

Ten o'clock closing. A. Subsections three and four of section twelve of "The Alcoholic Liquors Sale Control Act, 1893," are hereby repealed.

B. Section thirteen of "The Alcoholic Liquors Sale Control Act Amendment Act, 1895," is hereby repealed.

Bar at Bellamy's abolished.

Constable may demand name and address of persons found on licensed premises during closing hours.

C. No liquor shall be sold or exposed for sale within the precincts of the Parliament Buildings.

D. Any constable may demand the name and address of any person found on any premises during the period during which they are required by the provisions of the Licensing Acts to be closed; and, if he has reasonable ground to suppose that the name or address given is false, may require evidence of the correctness of such name and address; and may, if such person fail upon such demand to give his name or address or such evidence, apprehend him without warrant, and bring him as soon as practicable before a Justice of the Peace.

E. Any person required by a constable under the *preceding* section to give his name and address who fails to give the same or gives a false name and address shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding *five* pounds.

Clause 10: In line 31, to strike out all words after the word "every," and to insert the words "successive year thereafter."

Clause 14: In line 40, after the word "county," to insert the following words: "the Premier of the colony for the time being, the president of any Licensed Victuallers' Association adjacent to such licensing district, and the president of any Rugby Union football club in any such district."
