

SUPPLEMENTARY ORDER PAPER.

HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES.

Thursday, the 8th day of August, 1872.

1. Mr. BATHGATE to move, in Committee on the Licensing Bill, The insertion of the following clauses:—

New Sections after Section 11.

12. The grocer's license shall be in the form in the Schedule hereunto annexed, and shall authorize the holder to sell and deliver alcoholic liquors in quantities not exceeding two gallons of any one description of liquor to one person at any one time; such liquors not to be consumed in or upon the vendor's shop house or premises, and only to be sold in bottles corked sealed and capsuled or wired, of sizes not less than those of which six or twelve are usually reckoned to the gallon, and which shall have been so corked sealed and capsuled or wired before coming into the possession of the holder of a retail license.

13. It shall be lawful for the Superintendent of any Province, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, from time to time and at any time, to issue licenses to be called "bush licenses," authorizing the occupier of any house situated in remote or thinly-peopled districts to sell alcoholic liquors in such house for the use of *bona fide* travellers: Provided that no person shall be so licensed if his house be within ten miles of any house occupied by the holder of a publican's license, nor unless it shall appear to the Superintendent in Council that there is need of a house for the accommodation of travellers at the place where such house is situate.

It shall not be lawful for the holder of any one license to hold another license of a different class.

Before the issue of a grocer's license shall be made, the applicant shall find security to the satisfaction of the Clerk of the Licensing Court for the payment of all fines or penalties he may incur, to the amount of one hundred pounds.

It shall not be lawful for any person to recover by process of law any debt under the amount of ten pounds due to him for alcoholic liquors supplied by retail to any person on credit. Any person fraudulently making a false entry in his books, or in any account claim or demand in relation to alcoholic liquors supplied by him on credit, so as to conceal the nature of the articles sold on credit, shall forfeit the sum of twenty pounds.

FORM OF GROCER'S LICENSE.

WHEREAS A.B. of _____, hath deposited in this office a certificate from the _____, at the annual Licensing Court held under "The Licensing Act, 1872," at _____, on the _____ day of _____, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and _____, authorizing the issue to the said A.B. of the license in the said Act called the Retail License, for the shop or store occupied by the said A.B., situated in _____, in the said Province of _____: And whereas the said A.B. hath paid into my office the sum of _____, as the duty on the said license: Now I, the Treasurer of the Province, in pursuance of and by virtue of the powers vested in me by the said Act, do hereby license the said A.B. to sell and deliver alcoholic liquors in quantities not exceeding two gallons of any one description of liquor to one person at any one time; such liquors not to be consumed in or upon the shop store house or premises, and only to be sold in bottles corked sealed and capsuled or wired, of sizes not less than those of which six or twelve are usually reckoned to the gallon, and which shall have been so corked sealed and capsuled or wired before coming into the possession of the said A.B. And this license shall commence upon the first day of _____ next, and continue in force till the thirtieth day of June then next ensuing, both days inclusive, provided it be not forfeited in the meantime, according to the provisions of the said Act.
