LICENSING BILL.

Sir W. Fox, in Committee, to move the following new clause, after clause 207:—

Every person holding a publican's, club, or packet license shall, at all times during which his house or vessel is open for the sale of intoxicating liquors, keep for sale in his bar or some place easily accessible and adjoining thereto, a supply of ginger-beer, lemonade, and soda-water, and of hot tea and coffee, with sugar, ready for immediate use, and also some articles of solid food, such as buns, biscuits, sandwiches, bread and cheese, or the like, for sale at reasonable prices to any person who may demand the same; and any person neglecting or refusing to keep or to sell such articles shall, for every such neglect or refusal, be liable to a penalty of *five* pounds.
