LICENSING BILL.

1. Mr. Finn, in Committee, to move the following addition to section 73:—

In like manner any such Licensing Magistrate, or any two members of the Licensing Committee, may, on any occasion of a public ball, dinner, or other festivity, permit any house or premises to be kept open for the sale of liquor for such period as he or they may think fit.

2. Mr. Tole, in Committee, to move the following amendments:—

In section 29. To insert, after line $\bar{2}3$, the words "(3) Confectioners' licenses."

After section 31. To add the following new section:—

32. A confectioner's license shall authorize every person who shall keep a refreshment house, and shall pursue therein the trade or business of a confectioner, or shall keep open such house as an eating-house for the purpose of selling victuals to be consumed therein, to sell liquor to be consumed with such victuals between the hours of eight in the morning and eight at night: Provided such licensee shall not keep any public bar or tap-room on such premises.

In section 100. To insert, after line 26, "(3) For a confectioner's license, ten pounds."
