NOTICES RELATING TO ORDERS OF THE DAY.

LICENSING BILL.

Mr. STEVENS, in Committee, to move the following new clause :—

A New Zealand wine license shall authorize the holder thereof to sell and deliver wine, cider, and perry, made by himself from fruit grown in the colony, of a strength not exceeding thirty per centum of proof spirit, by retail in any quantity, not to be consumed on the premises where it is sold.

Clause 100. Add to section : "For a New Zealand wine license, *one pound.*"

FENCING BILL.

Mr. ACTON ADAMS, in Committee, to move the following amendments :—

Section 6. To add the words : "Such interest to be payable half-yearly, from the date of the expenditure."

Section 17, line 42. To strike out the word "two," and substitute "one."

Section 20, line 11. After words "impracticable land," to insert the words, "or land which is too steep for a permanent fence to be maintained thereon;" and in line 13, after word "watercourse," to insert the words "or land."

Section 22, line 45. To strike out the word "ten," and substitute "fifteen."

Section 32, line 11. After word "erection," to insert the word "position."

Schedule A. After clause 17, to insert,—

17A. For mountain fencing only.—A substantial wire fence, with posts of durable wood or iron, well and substantially erected of six steel or iron wires; the spaces between the four bottom wires not to exceed five inches, and the iron standards not to be more than twelve feet apart, with two lacings of wire between each such standard; the steel wires not to be lighter than number twelve, and the iron wires not to be lighter than number eight.
