LICENSING BILL.

1. Sir W. Fox, in Committee, to move the following amendments:—

To insert after section 45 the sections numbered 23 and 24 of "The Licensing Act, 1873."

Also, after section 207, to insert the following section:—

Every husband, wife, widow, child, orphan, guardian, employer, or other person who shall be injured in person, property, or means of support by any intoxicated person, or in consequence of the intoxication, habitual or otherwise, of any person, shall have a right of action against the person who may have sold liquor to the person by whose act the plaintiff shall have been injured, under the influence of which liquor the injury may reasonably be presumed to have been inflicted, and may sue for damages in respect thereof in any Court of competent jurisdiction. Any judgment for damages in such action against the keeper of any licensed publichouse shall be a lien on the house in which the liquor was sold, and may be levied thereon by sale or otherwise, or an order of the Court in which such damages were recovered.

Also, in section 35, line 10, to strike out the word "not."

Also, in section 72, lines 7 and 8, to strike out the words "by the Licensing Magistrate at any sitting of the Resident Magistrate's Court, as well as"
