LOCAL GOVERNMENT LAW REFORM BILL (NO. 2)

*Proposed Motion to Divide the Bill into 3 Bills*

Hon. WARREN COOPER, in Committee, to move the following motion:

That *clauses 1 to 144* and the Schedules (other than the Fifth Schedule) be a separate Bill, and for *clauses 1 and 2* and the heading to Part I there be substituted the following Title, enacting words, heading, and clause:

**An Act to amend the Local Government Act 1974**

BE IT ENACTED by the Parliament of New Zealand as follows:

**1. Short Title and commencement**—(1) This Act may be cited as the Local Government Amendment Act 1992, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Local Government Act 1974 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

(2) Except as provided in sections 9(3), 14(2), 15(2), 16(3), 56A(10), 64A(2), 64E(2), 67A(2), 69A(2), 71, 78(10), and 108(2) of this Act, this Act shall come into force on the 1st day of July 1992.

## PART I

## AMENDMENTS TO PRINCIPAL ACT

That *clauses 145 to 152B* and the *Fifth Schedule* be a separate Bill, and that for *clause 145* there be substituted the following Title, enacting words, and clause:

**An Act to amend the Local Elections and Polls Act 1976**

BE IT ENACTED by the Parliament of New Zealand as follows:

**1. Short Title and commencement**—(1) This Act may be cited as the Local Elections and Polls Amendment Act 1992, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Local Elections and Polls Act 1976 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

(2) This Act shall come into force on the day on which it receives the Royal assent.

That *clauses 153 to 162* be a separate Bill, and that for *clause 153* there be substituted the following Title, enacting words, and clause:

**An Act to amend the Rating Powers Act 1988**

BE IT ENACTED by the Parliament of New Zealand as follows:

**1. Short Title and commencement**—(1) This Act may be cited as the Rating Powers Amendment Act 1992, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Rating Powers Act 1988 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

(2) This Act shall come into force on the 1st day of July 1992.
