LICENSING TRUSTS AMENDMENT BILL

Proposed Amendments

Hon. Mr McLAY, in Committee, to move the following amendments:

Clause 8: To omit from lines 37 to 39 on page 8 the words "on any day other than a day on which the premises are required to be closed for the sale of liquor".

To omit from line 42 on page 8 the words "the Commission", and substitute the words "a District Court Judge".

To omit from line 1 on page 9, and also from line 9 on that page, the word "Commission", and substitute in each case the word "Judge".

Clause 9: To omit from line 34 on page 9 the words "the Commission", and substitute the words "a District Court Judge".

To omit from line 39 on that page, and also from line 4 on page 10, and also from line 14 on that page, the word "Commission", and substitute in each case the word "Judge".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

Clause 8: The first amendment removes inappropriate words: in fact, premises of this kind are not required by law to be closed on any day.

The other amendments transfer from the Commission to a District Court Judge jurisdiction under this clause in respect of later hours. This was recommended by the Statutes Revision Committee, but inadvertently omitted from the Bill on the report back.

Clause 9: The amendments are complementary to those proposed in respect of *clause 8* relating to jurisdiction. They will only be moved if the House supports the establishment of licensed cafes under the Sale of Liquor Amendment Bill. If the House does not support the establishment of such cafes, this clause will be opposed by the mover of this Paper, and the amendment will not be proceeded with.
