MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS ACT 1886 AMENDMENT (No. 2).

Mr. Morrison, in Committee, to move, That the following new clause be added:—

It shall be lawful for the Council, by resolution, to decide that all trees or shrubs which are growing on private property within ten feet of the boundary of any street within the borough are a nuisance, and to serve on the owner of the property upon which such trees or shrubs are growing a notice requiring him to cut down and remove the same, and should he fail or neglect to cut down and remove all trees growing within ten feet of the boundary of the street within fourteen days after the service of such notice, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding *five pounds* for every day that he shall allow or permit such trees or shrubs to continue growing on his land within ten feet of the boundary of the street.

MINING COMPANIES ACTS AMENDMENT BILL.

Mr. Pirani, in Committee, to move the following new clause:—

Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in "The Mining Companies Act, 1894," and its amendments, or in "The Companies Act, 1882," and its amendments, or in any other Act, no calls upon shares in any company formed or registered or incorporated after the passing of this Act for mining purposes, or for mining and other purposes combined, shall be recoverable except so far as the proceeds of such shares shall, when forfeited and sold, be made applicable in payment of the calls thereon.
