REGULATION OF ELECTIONS BILL.

Hon. Mr. Hall, in Committee, to move the following amendment:—

Section 57. To add the following:—"If he becomes a candidate for any district, either on his own nomination or with his consent on the nomination of ten electors, as provided by section eleven of this Act:

"Provided that any person who at a general election is elected for two districts shall be entitled to choose for which district he will sit, and such choice shall be made at the time and in manner directed by any standing or sessional order of the House of Representatives; and, if there be no such order, then in conformity with the practice of the House of Commons."

MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS ACT AMENDMENT BILL.

Mr. Allwright, in Committee, to move the following new clause after section 329:—

330. When there is no public library established in any borough, the Council may let by way of lease any land or buildings the property of the Corporation to Trustees, in trust for any society which has established, or shall be willing to establish, a library, for any term not exceeding sixty-six years, free of rent, or subject to such rent and conditions as such Council shall think fit; and may assist such library with annual grants of money out of the borough funds: Provided that such library shall be open to any of the ratepayers, subject to such rules and regulations as to charges and otherwise as shall be approved of by the Council, which rules and regulations shall not be allowed except with the approval of the Council.
