Māori Purposes Bill

Proposed motion to divide Bill into 4 Bills

Hon Parekura Horomia, in Committee, to move as follows:

That the enacting words, *clauses 1 and 2*, and *Part 1* be a separate Bill, and that for the enacting words, *clauses 1 and 2*, and the *Part 1* heading there be substituted the following enacting words and clauses:

The Parliament of New Zealand enacts as follows:

1 Title

This Act is—

- (a) Te Ture Whenua Maori Amendment Act 2006; or
- (b) the Maori Land Amendment Act 2006.

2 Commencement

This Act comes into force on the day after the date on which it receives the Royal assent.

That *Part 2* be a separate Bill, and that for the *Part 2* heading there be substituted the following enacting words and clauses:

The Parliament of New Zealand enacts as follows:

1 Title

This Act is the Treaty of Waitangi Amendment Act 2006.

2 Commencement

This Act comes into force on the day after the date on which it receives the Royal assent.

That *Part 3* be a separate Bill, and that for the *Part 3* heading there be substituted the following enacting words and clauses:

The Parliament of New Zealand enacts as follows:

1 Title

This Act is the Maori Fisheries Amendment Act **2006**.

2 Commencement

This Act comes into force on the day after the date on which it receives the Royal assent.

That *Part 4* be a separate Bill, and that for the *Part 4* heading there be substituted the following enacting words and clauses:

The Parliament of New Zealand enacts as follows:

1 Title

This Act is the Maori Commercial Aquaculture Claims Settlement Amendment Act **2006**.

2 Commencement

This Act comes into force on the day after the date on which it receives the Royal assent.
