NURSES AND MIDWIVES REGISTRATION AMENDMENT BILL.

Mr. YOUNG, in Committee, to move to add the following new clauses:—

Type of training-school to be recognized.

3. In prescribing the course of training to be undergone by candidates for examination under this Act, and the subjects in which they shall be examined, the Board shall determine that no training-school applying for recognition under the *last preceding* section shall be recognized unless it contains forty beds and makes adequate provision for the reception and treatment of infectious fevers, tuberculosis, and venereal diseases.

Prescribing training of candidates for examination.

4. The Board shall determine that no applicant for examination who has been trained in a school recognized under sections *two* and *three* hereof shall be admitted as a candidate for examination until such time as the Board is satisfied that the applicant for examination has had satisfactory training in acute and chronic medical cases and in the nursing and feeding of young children.

Reciprocal arrangement with Great Britain not to be prejudiced.

5. Before the Board shall authorize the registration of any person trained in a school under sections *two* and *three* hereof, it shall in all cases be satisfied that no such registration, if authorized, shall in any way whatsoever prejudice or weaken the reciprocal arrangement for inter-registration now obtaining between the New Zealand Nurses and Midwives Registration Board and the General Nursing Council for England and Wales.
