NOTICES RELATING TO ORDERS OF THE DAY.

NEW ZEALAND UNIVERSITY AND UNIVERSITY COLLEGES BILL.

Sir G. M. O'RORKE, in Committee, to move the following amendments:—

To omit that Part of the Bill relating to the New Zealand University: also the clauses affecting the Otago University and the Canterbury College; and the proposed appropriation of £25,000 for building Colleges in Auckland and Wellington.

To insert the following new clauses:—

Governing bodies of Auckland and Wellington Colleges appointed.

Upon the passing of this Act it shall be the duty of the Government to appoint a governing body, to be styled "The Auckland University College Council," consisting of eight members, and another governing body to be styled "The Wellington University College Council," consisting of eight members, to whom shall be intrusted the expenditure of all moneys to be provided by Parliament for the establishment of University Colleges in the Cities or suburbs of Auckland and Wellington respectively.

Commission for appointing Professors.

It shall be the duty of the said governing bodies to appoint jointly a Commission of four persons, resident in the United Kingdom, for the selection of the following Professors for each College, at the salaries set opposite their names:—

All graduates eligible.

The Commission in selecting such Professors is not to be restricted to graduates of the Universities of the United Kingdom, but to be at liberty to invite applications from graduates of European Universities; and the engagements with the Professors shall be, as nearly as possible, on the same terms and conditions as were made with the Professors of the Otago University, or Canterbury College, when they were engaged.

Present University endowments vested in governing bodies.

Whereas it is expedient to determine the application of certain of the lands referred to in section seven of "The University Endowment Act, 1868:—" Be it therefore enacted as follows:—

The land described in Schedule A. to this Act shall, on the coming into operation of this Act, vest in the governing body of the Auckland University College; and the land described in Schedule B to this Act shall, on the coming into operation of this Act, vest in the governing body of the Wellington University College: Provided always that the grants to be provided by Parliament for each College shall in each case be reduced in proportion to the income derived by each College from the said lands.
