### OZONE LAYER PROTECTION BILL

#### *Proposed Amendments*

Hon. SIMON UPTON, in Committee, to move the following amendments:

*Clause 7:* To omit this clause from pages 4 and 5, and substitute the following clause:

**7. Customs and Excise Act 1996 to apply to prohibited exports**—All the provisions of the Customs and Excise Act 1996 that apply with respect to prohibited exports (except the penalty for an offence against section 209 (1) (b)) shall apply with respect to the export of any substances and goods in contravention of this Act, in all respects as if the export of those substances and goods were prohibited under Part V of the Customs and Excise Act 1996.

*Clause 19:* To omit this clause from pages 17 and 18.

*Clause 20:* To omit from line 7 on page 18 the words "Customs Act 1966", and substitute the words "Customs and Excise Act 1996".

*Clause 21:* To omit from line 21 on page 18 the words "Comptroller of Customs or the Chief Executive of the Ministry of Commerce", and substitute the words "New Zealand Customs Service or the Ministry of Commerce".

*Clause 27:* To add to this clause on page 20 the following subclause:

(3) The Customs and Excise Act 1996 is hereby consequentially amended by repealing so much of the Fifth Schedule as relates to the Ozone Layer Protection Act 1990.

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

The proposed amendments have 2 principal effects—

- (a) Alignment of the Bill with the new Customs and Excise Act 1996; and
- (b) Removal of *clause 19* of the Bill, which applies the analysis of samples provisions of the Toxic Substances Act 1979. That Act will be repealed when the new Hazardous Substances and New Organisms Act 1996 comes into force. The HASNO Act does not carry forward those analysis of samples provisions.
