PUBLIC HEALTH BILL.

Mr. HANAN, in Committee, to move the following new clause:—

No person shall sell any patent or proprietary medicine, drug, or compound of which a sample has not been analysed by the Government Analyst, and without the copy of a certificate by the Government Analyst being annexed to the bottle, box, or package in which the medicine, drug, or compound is contained, stating the component parts of the same according to the sample, under a penalty not exceeding *twenty* pounds:

Provided that the Central Board of Health may, if it shall think fit, and for the prescribed fee, grant a license to sell any such patent or proprietary medicine, and to dispense with the certificate hereinbefore mentioned, if the said Board is satisfied that the medicine, drug, or compound contains no deleterious ingredient, and that no false representation is made respecting the same, either on the label or package, or by advertisement, or otherwise.
