NOTICE OF MOTION.

1. Mr. TANCRED, in Committee on the Appeals from Provincial Rating Bill, to move the omission of all the clauses from 3 to 13 inclusive, and the substitution of the following clause:—

It shall be lawful for the Superintendent and Provincial Council by any Act or Ordinance to establish any tribunal or tribunals for the hearing and determining appeals against any rate imposed or assessed on any land, or any person in respect of any land, for the making maintaining or repairing of roads within the Province, or for contribution for fencing or any such purpose, and from time to time to alter the constitution of such tribunal or tribunals.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON PUBLIC ACCOUNTS.

THE Select Committee on Public Accounts having, by the request of the Honourable the Colonial Treasurer, had under their consideration clauses 90 to 95 of the Immigration and Public Works Bill, have the honour to report that they have agreed to the following Resolutions respecting those clauses:—

1. That in clauses 90 and 94 of the Immigration and Public Works Bill, it shall be made to appear that the accounts mentioned are branches of the Special Fund.
2. That it shall be made clear that the authority with respect to the payment of money is to be exercised by more than one agent.
3. That it be made clear the requisitions are to be for purposes for which money is by law available within six months after the requisition being signed.
4. That a clause similar, as far as the circumstances admit, to clause 95, be made to apply to clause 91.
