PUBLIC WORKS ACTS AMENDMENT BILL.

Mr. T. MACKENZIE to move the following new clause after clause 7 of the Bill:—

Planting of gorse  
in fence border-  
ing roads pro-  
hibited.

7A. From and after the commencement of this Act it shall not be lawful for any person to sow or plant gorse as a fence, or in any boundary-fence already existing, dividing any land from a county or district road; and the local authority having the control of such road may order the occupier, or, in case there is no occupier, then the owner, of any land on which such gorse is planted or sown to remove and dig up the same, and on failure to comply with any such order within one month of the date thereof the local authority aforesaid may remove and dig up the same, and such occupier or owner as aforesaid shall be liable to pay the costs incurred by the local authority in digging up the same, to be recovered in a summary way.

The provisions of section *nine* hereof shall apply to any order made by a local authority under this section.

RIVER BOARDS ACT 1884 AMENDMENT BILL.

Mr. T. MACKENZIE, in Committee, to move:—

Travelling-ex-  
penses of  
members of  
Board.

7. The Board of every river district may from time to time vote such reasonable sums as it shall deem sufficient to defray the actual travelling-expenses only of members of the Board coming from a distance exceeding three miles to attend the meetings of the Board, but not the Committee meetings.

No person being the holder of a free pass on a railway shall be paid any money in respect of expenses for travelling on such railway.
